## Category 1. Street Photography – Black & White Images

Street photography is a type of “documentary photography” that features subjects/people in candid situations within public places such as streets, parks, beaches, malls, political conventions and other settings, in other words, street photography includes photos taken anywhere in *public places*.

- All photos must be taken from **September 17 , 2011** to **November 17 , 2011**.
- All submissions must be in by **November 17 , 2011**.
- You are limited to five (5) images. You can enter your photos in any of the categories.
- Each entry must be accompanied by your **name, category and level**. Your image filename must read as follow: Your Name\_Category\_Level. Eg: Alain Leury\_Spring\_L2
- Digital submissions must be a **maximum of 1024 px** on the long side (vertical or horizontal).

- Judging will be done by appointed judges.

- 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners in each category will receive the honor of being published on the CPOPC website (if desired).
